

Parents Code of Behaviour



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- Do not force your child to play cricket if they don't want to
 - Remember, your child plays cricket for their enjoyment, not yours
 - Encourage your child to play by the rules
 - Teach your child that honest effort is as important as victory
 - Focus on your child's efforts and performance, rather than on winning or losing
 - Turn defeat into victory by helping your child to improve their skills and have good sportsmanship
 - Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game
 - Children learn best by example
 - Praise good play by all players of both teams playing
 - Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from children's cricket
 - Do not publicly question officials' decisions and teach your child to do so as well
 - Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not play.
 - Respect and value every child regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion
